





Emotion	Sample quotes
Excited	Because he/her get to meet new people.
	It's the animal's first time seeing me this year, after quite a while! 
Sad	Because when we are quiet he plays around and looks at us.
	Because it's sad and nervous to see big giants. I think that the animal feels sad because he/she does this a lot and it never stops and nervous  because she does not know us.
Happy	Because he is in a new place and he probably likes new people.
	Chloe realizes that I don't want to hurt her and she has decided I am safe to be around. She's also watching me!! 
	I think the animal feels (happy) because she seen us more than once. She was in her playpen and she was running.
Nervous	It's a little animal & we're like giants to the chinchilla.
	They are sensitive.
	He's never met us before & it might be scary for him.
	Last year he was nervous and shaking a lot. 
Nothing	The animal will feel nervous because he has never been out of the zoo.
	Because he has probably met kids and seen kids feeling the same way as we are. 
Mixed emotions	(Feels) the good emotions because he has company! But he might be scared because he doesn't know us.




Grade 3, Post: Animal Ambassador students were more likely than Animal Connections students to define empathy as feeling bad for someone, and less likely to see it as understanding how another feels.




Grade 3 and 4, Post: Animal Connections students were more likely over time to describe empathy as understanding how another feels.

Response categories	AC: 3 rd grade post	AC: 4 th grade post	Sample quotes
Be nice to them	36%	 21%	It means like say if someone fall and someone help you up that's empathy. It means be friendly to people you know and being nice.
Care how they feel	30%	30%	Empathy means to care about each other. It means to feel them.
Feel the way they do	17%	16%	To be in peoples' shoes. Empathy means to feel the same emotion as someone else.
Understand how they feel	7%	 31%	When you see the person's face ...you know if they're mad or not. Look at her face and body for clues.
Feel bad for them	3%	<1%	You feel sad for them. It mean you feel bad for a person when something sad happen to her.
Treat with respect	4%	3%	It means be kind and nice and respectful to one another and even animals.
Other	5%	2%	1-2 students apiece gave other definitions


Grade 3, Post: Students in both programs identified finding food/water and avoiding predators as primary threats their neighborhood animal would face.




Grade 3, Post: Animal Connections students were more likely to list protecting animals from humans, leaving animals alone, and protecting them from predators as actions they could take to help animals in their neighborhood.




Grade 4, Post: "Can kids your age help animals that live in the rainforest?"




Those who answered "yes": "What are some ways kids your age can help animals that live in the rainforest?"
